INVESTMENT STRATEGY

Vericimetry US Small Cap Value Fund is a noload mutual fund seeking to provide a specific asset class risk-reward exposure combined with long-term capital appreciation. The Fund invests in a wide and diverse universe of marketable US small-value stocks using a market cap weighted approach. The Fund's managers employ a pre-determined "Enhanced Index" investing strategy designed to outperform the Russell 2000 Value benchmark over long term time horizon.

The Fund's small-cap universe is comprised of US securities with a market cap that is often less than 10% of the total market capitalization. The Fund's value universe is comprised of US securities with multiple well-established value factors such as high book-to-market, low priceto-earnings, low price-to-operating cash flow, and low price-to-sales.

The Fund is currently available through an exclusive group of registered investment advisers who seek to benefit from the small and value risk premiums on behalf of their buyand-hold clients.





VALUATION RATIO DEFINITIONS

- Book-to-Market: A company's book value of its net assets to its market value.
- Price to Book: A company's share price compared to the book value of its net assets as given in its balance sheet.
- Price to Earnings: A company's share price compared to its per share earnings for the previous twelve months.
- Price to Sales: A company's share price compared to its per share revenue for the previous twelve months.
- Price to Operating Cash Flow: A company's share price to its per share operating cash flow for the previous twelve months.
